Effective May 18th, a general purpose command, GENCØM, will be available. This command calls any specified command with any binary pattern for arguments. The command:

GENCOM NAME oct1, oct2, oct1, oct2, ... oct1, oct2,

(where NAME is the name of a command and octly, oct2, octl2, oco, oct2n are fields of six octal digits) will start the command

NAME arg1 arg2 ...argn

where each argument, \arg_1 , is a binary word whose octal representation is the pair of octal fields, $octl_1 oct2_{1^\circ}$

This command can be used when dealing with a file which has unprintable characters in its name, provided one knows the octal representation of the name.
