To begin with, this is to confirm our conversation regarding your online 1200-baud printer and, for the sake of a better mechanism for charging, the IPC will allocate one high speed asynchronous port for your use with your Vadic modem. Please understand that this "arrangement" of a dedicated port could not possibly apply to an unlimited number of users because of 355 capacity and it is our intent to explore a long-term solution since we anticipate that remote printers of this kind may become fashionable.

On the second issue (interconsole communication), I am not sure that your recommended daemon solution is the correct approach and would appreciate a further look into other alternatives. In this regard, I am asking Bob Daley's group, specifically Roger Roach, to contact you on this subject and arrive at the best way to handle it. An absentee process is one approach that may be more acceptable. One concern I have is that the process, whatever it is, starts up automatically; is not an issue for "operations" to concern themselves about and is easily chargeable to some project.

Getting back to the modem -- will you please let Leo Ryan know the specifics of the Vadic you plan to provide at IPC and what telephone/wire connection will be involved. Our Vadics are due this month; I assume yours is due sometime after that.

Let me know of any problems which occur.
