Subject: June, 1974, ARPA IPTO Budget

On July 2, 1974, Richard Feiertag attended an ARPA graduate student conference at which the budget of the ARPA Information Processing Techniques Office (IPTO) was described. Following are my notes on Feiertag's description of the presentation:

The Information Processing Techniques Office has a budget for Fiscal year 1975 of about \$35M to \$40M. As of June, 1974, it plans to divide this budget among three major programs as follows:

(~\$14M) Information Processing Techniques

(~\$15M) Distributed Information Systems

Advanced Command, Control, and Communication Technology

(~\$9M)

- The ARPA IPTO money flows from two department of defense budget items known as "6.1" and "6.2". These two items are part of a 2. \$7.9B allocation for the entire defense department organized as follows:
 - Research 6.1
 - Development 6.2
 - 6.3 Test
 - Evaluation 6.4

Apparently most of the \$7.9B is concentrated in items 6.3 and 6.4.
