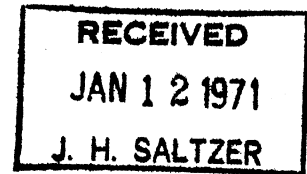

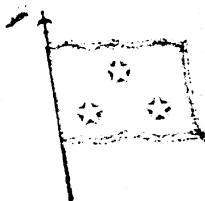
I am herewith enclosing General Van Ryzin's letter of appreciation for the recent MIT/MAC briefing to Marine Corps personnel.
